SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

- Updates from the May DCHI Board meeting were shared with Committee members, along with information on the SIM grant and overall program administration that were delivered at the May Health Care Commission meeting. The Health Care Commission is in the process of restructuring funding opportunities through state procurement to accomplish Year 3 goals, several of which tie back to Clinical Committee initiatives.

- Committee members reviewed recent Practice Transformation figures and analyzed milestone achievement by vendor in addition to average practice scores across all milestones.
- Representatives from the Delaware Quality of Life Coalition attended the meeting to discuss the Coalition’s initiatives and potential opportunities for collaboration with DCHI and the Clinical Committee regarding physician engagement with advanced directive and palliative care offerings in Delaware.
- Representatives from Aloysius Butler & Clark also attended the meeting to discuss their scope of work with the Health Care Commission to assist in developing and implementing provider engagement strategies to include the following Clinical Committee initiatives:
 - Practice Transformation
 - Behavioral Health Electronic Medical Record Assistance
 - Behavioral Health Integration
 - Common Scorecard
- The Committee also briefly reviewed the proposed agenda for the June DCHI Cross-Committee meeting which will focus on payment reform.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- One member of the public suggested future Practice Transformation updates should include enrollment figures from other vendors not engaged in DCHI’s Practice Transformation initiative. This individual also mentioned the increase in the number of providers transitioning towards a concierge approach.

NEXT STEPS

- Continue to engage the Delaware Quality of Life Coalition to discuss potential collaboration opportunities.
- Follow up with Aloysius Butler & Clark to discuss next steps for developing provider engagement strategies.
